

## Visitation in Residential Aged Care Facilities – Key Considerations

This checklist outlines key considerations for the adoption of relevant guidance around visitation in residential aged care facilities during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Key Considerations		
	Maintain residents' social contact and support safe visitation in line with guidance materials	
	Also consider advice in the <u>Industry Code for Visiting Residential Aged Care Homes during COVID-19</u>	
	Ensure each resident can be visited by one Essential Visitor (Partners in Care, Named Visitors, End of Life) at all times, including during management of an outbreak or exposure	
	See Partnerships in Care factsheet for information on implementing Partner in Care arrangements	
	Consider developing a register (or similar) of Essential Visitors, including having this in place prior to experiencing an outbreak	
	Continue access to volunteers during outbreaks	
	Consider arrangements for non-essential visitors (i.e. contactless visits) when an exposure or outbreak has been declared	
	Allow visitors to enter parts of the facility unaffected by outbreak if they are willing to comply with risk mitigations	
	Manage visitation for residents with COVID-19 using a risk-based approach and consult with PHU to determine appropriate mitigations	
	Maintain screening of visitors	
	Provide education and facilitate training on risk mitigation strategies and IPC, including use of PPE, for Essential Visitors and volunteers	
	Supply appropriate PPE, including RAT kits, to Essential Visitors and volunteers	
	Supervise visitor compliance with IPC measures	
	Include arrangements for visitation in Outbreak Management Plan and communication materials, and proactively communicate this information to all visitors and residents	
	Consult with residents about visitation arrangements during outbreaks	
	Consult the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission's statement regarding visitor access to residential aged care
